- Obtain your Certificate of Eligibility (COE)
- Submit COE to our office after you have registered for classes

- Contact your parish VA office for an initial interview
- Once approved you will receive a certificate in the mail
- Submit a copy of the original to our office
- Make sure seal is visible
- Must be full time
- You will be responsible for remaining fees

- You will be responsible for fees not covered by exemption

Student Support Services Veterans

Types of Services

Services include instruction in basic study skills; tutorial services; academic, financial, or personal counseling; assistance in securing admission and financial aid for enrollment in four-year institutions; assistance in securing admission and financial aid for enrollment in graduate and professional programs; guidance on career options; mentoring and special services for students with limited English proficiency (LEP); and college scholarships.

Participant Eligibility for Program Services

Participants must be enrolled or accepted for enrollment in a program of postsecondary education at a grantee institution (UL Lafayette). Low-income students who are first-generation college students and students with disabilities evidencing academic need are eligible to participate in SSS-V projects. Participants must also have 180 active duty days completed. Two- thirds of the participants in any SSS program must be either disabled or potential firstgeneration college students from lowincome families.

Participant Eligibility for Grant Aid

Student Support Services Veteran participants must be active participants in the SSS-V Program who are in their first two years of postsecondary education. In addition, such participants must be receiving Federal Pell Grants. Grant aid may be offered to students who have completed their first two years of postsecondary education and are receiving Federal Pell Grants. In such cases the institution would demonstrate that participants are at high risk of dropping out and have first met the needs of all eligible first and secondyear students.
